This book absolutely does not deliver what I expect from Lonely Planet. You can only find very basic information about towns in Argentina, tour operators, restaurants, and accommodation. NOTHING ELSE. Not even basic information about various treks - you need to purchase the LP Trekking in Patagonian Andes to find that. For my purposes (backpacking in Patagonia, traveling between Argentina and Chile), I would have been better served by purchasing the LP South America on a Shoestring (has nearly the same information as LP Argentina, with info on other countries) and LP Trekking in Patagonian Andes books.
